Chip Siskey—

Vase made from Honey Locust with small bark spot on one side.

Wall thickness is ~ 1/4" on the sides.

Vase was finished with Beale Lacquer.


Finished Size is about 6" in dia. by 9" tall.

<u>Harlan Henke</u>-- Three Natural Edge Bowls—







The above two smaller ones are from Ash and the larger one at right from Birch. They are finished with a clear gloss finish; Wall thickness about 3/8" on small bowls and 1" on larger bowl.

The Large bowl is about 6" tall; the smaller ones about 4" tall. The small one above, at left, is about the same height as the medium oval one on the right. The two Ash bowls are the same color—see the one on the right above.

Note the details and knots left in the turning of the thick walled bowl in the picture on the right.



<u>Kent Townsend--</u> Rolling pin made from Mesquite. Diameter of main body is about 2-1/2" in diameter and about 12" long with 3" handles on each end. Handles are about 1-1/4" in diameter to accommodate someone with arthritis in their hands. Finish is several coats of flax oil.



<u>Andy Brundage--</u> Turning tool set. These tools are made from tool steel, both round and square. The tool on the far right has a special insert with pressed-in bearings so the insert can turn. Body is made from brass tubing. Handles are turned from oak with brass ferrules.



Mikeal Jones- Ring made of Mahogany and twisted Copper wire embedded in CA glue. Groove at the bottom of the embedding is flat-bottomed to allow the wire to lay evenly. Size is about a #9 ring size. (enlarged here to show detail)

Pen Mandrel with tapered cones to hold ring was used to turn and finish the ring after embedding the wire. .

PROGRAM VIEWS



Kent Townsend begins a baby rattle. The wood is hard maple and is about 1-1/2" square by about 8" long as a blank. After laying out the basic shapes and turning the two end pieces into round balls, the center is ready to make the two rattles. Note in the following pictures on page 5 the progression from bead to rattle pieces.









Sequential development of the rattle shape and parts shown here.



Final smoothing of the shaft where the rattles are in the center is done BEFORE finishing the turning. Note the one ring is stationary in the picture at the right while sanding the center shaft.





Finishing off the mounting pieces on the lathe. Final removal of end done with knife and sandpaper AFTER removing from the lathe.



FINISHED PRODUCT in picture on the right. If a finish is desired one can use flax oil or mineral oil from a pharmacy.
