SHOW AND TELL



Another of **Danny Smith**'s finds/builds is this foot-powered lathe. Shown in the far left picture is the back side and in the near side is the operator side. At the lower left in the near photo is a spring that causes the rope to retract when pressure is released on the treadle at the bottom. Not sure how the turning is made to turn but I think it has something to do with wrapping the rope around the piece being turned(?).

Rather unique and minimum cost, discounting the walnut used to build the frame of the lathe.



Some more of Danny Smith's bowls made from scraps picked up where he works. Nice turnings with interesting grain patterns; especially in the one on the left. Approximate size can be told by the \$5 bill under it.



Here's another look at **David Bartlett's** goblet that he turned at the September ZOOM meeting. It has been final sanded but no finish put on yet. The far left one was the pattern he used to give the idea.



This bowl is made from bark-on Walnut that was stored in David's wood area. No telling how long it had been cut but the bark stayed on when David turned it. It is about 7" in diameter with bowl depth of about 3 to 3-1/2". Only an oil finish, maybe Walnut oil (?). Thanks to everyone who has helped with our plug orders in the past. We will be asking for help getting other projects to raise funds. All ideas are welcome along with samples.
