

All in all, a great time bidding was had by all involved. High bidder was Carl Sievering.






This ornament may have been made by David Halter (?). The imitation Cork at the right was made by ???



With time still on the clock, so to speak, Chip Siskey did a quick turning/carving project showing how to make a Christmas tree ornament like the one he had entered in the Auction. The following pictures detail the steps in producing the shape before finishing.





Taking a 2—2-1/2" square of Maple, turn a taper for about 4" on the end. Lay out 4 circles spaced about 1" apart

and divide the turning equally into 6 divisions laterally as in the right hand picture. Then on EVERY OTHER line trace a spiral so that 3 equally spaced lines are present. Using a small round taper

file, go between the lines spirally around the turning to produce 3 grooves with their point (high part) ON the LINES drawn.

Actually, it is more like a round rasp similar to a Stanley product. Changing to a gouge-like rasp



continue to make the grooves deeper.



Chip then took another special purpose tool, a sander that uses a strip of sanding cloth and proceeded to smooth out the grooves made previously.



This is the final product with the small finial on top added after all sanding is complete. Final turning requires making the base after the grooving is complete and sanding is done.

Chip used a sprayed lacquer finish on the tree ornament.

All the turning took less than 30 minutes from rough square blank to what is shown at the right in the chuck.
