Of course you know that wood grows on trees. But what else do you need to know about wood and the trees it comes from? For starters, you need to understand something about wood grain and how those patterns of light and dark streaks and swirls affect the shape you want to turn and even the choice of tools to use at the lathe. You also need to have an understanding of wood's dark side—how its dust as well as substances in the wood itself can affect your health, and how you can protect yourself.


