Treasurer **Chip Siskey** brought a **Soft Maple** bowl with a rope edge. His take was **Soft Maple** is hard to finish since it tends to be too soft. This has a really nice look and good depth. (*Ed. Side note—would make a good communion plate for church if it was about another 2" in diameter.*)

The craftsmanship is really sharp and the rope pattern shows good definition to the individual raised parts of the pattern. Great job Chip!



Mikeal Jones brought an “off-center” turned bowl with a rim of **Hard Maple** and a center of **Walnut**. This was an interesting piece that showed some nice grain in the center and on the outside rim. Nice solid base to this bowl.



Steve Dougherty brought a bowl/plate (?) made from **Spalted Sycamore** and **Walnut**. The **Spalted Sycamore** was assembled as a segmented piece and the **Walnut** was added to the bottom of the segmented piece.



Kent Townsend brought a box designed after the batons being done as a Club project. The “handle” comes off the other at one of the two beads where it slides into the part on the left. Good matching job Kent.



Dick Day brought a **Maple Box** with a black finial on top. The shape looks like a mushroom when assembled. Nice box with a nicely turned finial. Good Job Dick!



Not to be outdone, Club President *David Bartlett* brought a **Walnut** box. Not just ANY box but it had contents. When opened, out came many little tops AND another box with a tiny top inside. Well done, David. And they ALL would spin.



Tony Mansheim turned a three-piece box of **Walnut**. What started as one piece of wood became three separate entities each with some kind of cavity. Note the signature on the lower right picture piece showing the bottom box. Nice work Tony!



David Scott turned Small chalice with a Lid from **Walnut**. Nice smooth finishing And interesting grain Pattern in the finished Turning. This turning is about 5" tall when assembled.



(*Unknown*) turned this chalice from Walnut with a lid. It is a nice turning with a very pleasing shape and design.

Treasurer **Chip Siskey** also brought a small box that looks like a Genie's Lamp. It was also made of **Walnut** and had a nice finial as part of the lid. The finish was Lacquer sprayed in several coats to give a really nice shine to the **Walnut**. This was about 3" tall and was really shiny as evidenced by the picture at the right.
