## Show and Tell



Mel Bryan brought this little Utensil caddy. Made with Boxelder it has a satin lacquer finish. The diameter is about 4" and about 5-1/2" tall.



Mel also had Friction fit lidded boxes made with Boxelder and cherry. Friction polish was used for a finish to provide the sheen shown in these pictures.



Mel also had this Boxelder lidded box, also finished with a friction polish finish. The grain of the lid aligns with the grain of the container as can be seen in the right picture.









Mel was also busy duplicating what Mother Nature does naturally by making flowers. The Wood type is insignificant (alder & poplar flowers. Mulberry was used for the holder of the flowers which have stems of bamboo. No finish was used on the stems. Mel indicated he might do a demo sometime in the future showing how the flowers are made.





Mel also brought two turnings that were done and decorated initially using a small chainsaw. This gave the radial lines from the center out. The one on the left was finished clear in the center and the one on the right used a dye similar to one used by one of the previous demonstrators in a previous month. Lacquer and dies were

used to color the surfaces giving an iridescent sheen to the surface. Mel's comment was that the process was a bit nerve-wracking using the chainsaw.

### Program Highlights—Turning challenge

Since the pattern was an empty cone, contestants were encouraged to add a "scoop or two" to their finished turning.

The second set of contestants were Turn North Editor Leland Finley and Steve Dougherty. Two minutes doesn't seem very long when turning wood under pressure in a turning challenge. Parting off was not included in either of these two examples but a recognizable shape did emerge for both.









The final contestant was Club Treasurer Chip Siskey. His cone has a "cherry" on top of the two scoops of "ice cream and met the requirements but barely!

Declared the winner of the Turning Challenge was Mel Bryan. With a REALLY stubby cone (*wonder who his baker is*?) he came up with the most complete turning of the five contestants.

Chip's was almost as good but the "cherry" on top did add a slight distraction to the original order.
