### Best of Show 2023





Mikeal Jones' Sycamore bowl from *January* 2023.

Turned with the help of an Administer jig in chuck, the finish is a rubbed wax.

**Tony Mansheim** turned a three-piece box of **Walnut** for the *February* 2023 meeting.

What started as one piece of wood became three separate entities each with





Steve Dougherty brought a multi-segment Urn for March 2023 Show and tell.

Made from **Walnut**, **Hickory** and **Purple Heart**, the finish is **Spar Poly** and **Tung Oil** mix and applied in multiple coats.

The total piece was made in two parts with the Walnut bottom part turned and smoothed inside before attaching the Hickory top.





**Mikeal Jones** brought two examples of corner turning of a cube for **April 2023 Show and Tell**. This one was glued up from scrap boards into a cube shape.

Mikeal oriented the cube shape so that two diagonal corners were used for center locations. Initial Turning requires some finesse, particularly if the cube is very large as in the far left example.



**Dwight Herrick** brought a couple of examples of his Duck Calls for the May 2023 S & T. The light-colored call is made of **Cedar** and the dark one is **Walnut**. His business is *Salem Ridge Woodworks*<sup>TM</sup> and that is the brand applied to his calls.

The Walnut call also has Dwight's rendition of ducks in flight for decoration on the side of the call body.

Dwight is also quite accomplished "blowing" on a call he has made.



**Mikeal Jones** brought a platter/bowl that he made of **Poplar** for the **June 2023 S&T**. The exterior rim decoration was done with a ball tool in a Dremel. What appears to be "domino" design is really just a random pattern in the center three rings. Finishes include dewaxed Shellac on the bowl first to seal the wood after a stain of orange, yellow and walnut alcohol base dyes were applied. Lines were angled through the center of the rings to divide the "domino" patterns around the rim. The decorated rings were colored with black, bronze and silver colors and sealed with Mod Podge.





The most interesting turnings at the **July 2023 S&T** show were **Mel Bryan's** "flowers". They are made using "scraps" that are about 1" in cross section and about 3-4" long.



In addition to being an accomplished wood turner, **Kent Townsend** is also an accomplished spoon carver. Seemingly no wood is too difficult for Kent to carve.

At left is **Buckhorn** on top and **Birch below** which **Kent** brought for the **August 2023 S & T**. No finish is used or at best a food-grade oil finish is applied.

Kent was warned that the spoon shape in the top picture was difficult to produce, however, Kent seemly had little problem doing it in a class that he took.





Mikeal Jones brought some examples of offset turning to display for the September 2023 S&T before being the presenter for the September

meeting.





**Jim Tate** brought an interesting turning he labeled (?) for the October 2023 S&T. More accurately it should be called an art piece since it contains several unique design pieces.

First of all, the base started out as a round turning. Sliced into two narrower pieces it was reglued aligning the turned lines on the base. The same goes for the large part of the upper form.

However, the upper piece is hollow and is covered with a flat, thin piece of **Walnut**. The top shape is a turning that contains both **Hard Maple** and **Walnut**. It is centered on the upper shape and gives a unique design to the whole piece. The major parts of the object are made from **Oak**. The support between the upper and the base is a random shape that is fitted into both parts to add to the design.



Club President **David Bartlett** brought a new "twist" on a nut cracker for the **November 2023 S&T**. Made from **Walnut** including sapwood **Walnut** for the screw, it works very well. David used a wood tap and die to make the threads on the screw and in the body.
