**Steve Dougherty** brought an **Apricot** wood bowl. The finish is Tung Oil—multiple coats to produce the shine shown above.



# Program Highlights




Club Treasurer Chip Siskey brought an "Upside Down" salt shaker which he proceeded to turn as the program highlight.

Several steps are needed to make salt come out correctly.

Follow along as Chip turns the piece. The blank is Maple, chosen to match a pepper mill that the salt shaker needs to match.










The blank is about 2-1/2" square and about 5" long. After locating the centr on both ends and marking, it the blank is inserted into a "One-Way" type 4-jaw chuck for turning.

Just about any closed-grain wood can be used to make this item but the wood should not impart any flavor to the salt contained inside.










Once the blank is turned to a cylindrical shape a tenon is turned on the tail-stock end so the blank can be turned around and finish-turned. Then a hole is starred in the end and a "forbidden" tool is used to enlarge the hole.





After finishing the shape of the outside a groove is turned into what will become the bottom to hold the shaker insert.







After changing chucks to an internal finger chuck and turning the blank around agein the "ball" or top of the shaker is begun. Comparing it to the pepper mill for spacing and size, the ball top is shaped.





Using another blank about the same size as the original the insert that makes it into an "upside down" salt shaker is begun. It also sis made of Maple.











The diameter for fitting inside the body is turned and the base is hollowed out. Then using a large Cone Dead center (*actually live to turn*) the finished shape is turned on the outside of the insert. A hole is drilled to allow the salt to come out once the two parts are assembled together.






The insert is removed and ready to assemble to the outer base.
