SHOW & TELL

Mikeal Jones brought a bowl turned from **Apricot** wood. It is finished with Lacquer and is about 7-8" in diameter with an indentation of about 2-1/2" for the bowl part. The irregularity is caused by the shape of the blank and "defects" in the original piece. Nice Job Mikeal!!









Steve Dougherty brought a laminated bowl made from Mulberry, Apricot and Maple. It is about 9" from diagonal corner to diagonal corner.

The bottom of the bowl is about 3-1/2" in diameter with a total depth of the bowl about 4-1/2". It is finished with Lacquer. Nice turning Steve!!

V.P. Danny Smith brought two Walnut bowls. Unfortunately the "camera gremlin" must have eaten the pictures since no picture could be found. The bowl blanks were made using a McNaughton bowl

blank turning device with the larger one about 8" in diameter and the smaller one about 5-1/2" in diameter. Depth of the larger one was about 5" and the smaller one about 3-1/2" (Ed. Note: Sorry Danny)

The meeting in May should show you some interesting "Road Kill" turnings! The Rule was to make something from a piece of material found on the road and brought home to turn. There should be some interesting things and materials on display. June's newsletter will highlight the "findings".



Irogram Highlights

Club Vice President Danny Smith was the featured turner for the March 2024 meeting. One of Danny's specialties is turning small parts for his wife's yarn and fleece work. He also sells these in several places. For the March meeting Danny chose to make a Shawl Pin and a Skein stand part.

Let's follow Danny as he sets up and turns these pieces for the attendees at the meeting.

Starting with a square blank about 8" long and 1" square mounted in a "One Way" chuck with small finger jaws, Danny turned the blank round using a Roughing Gouge.

Using a fingernail-grind spindle gouge Danny proceeded to begin shaping the Shawl Pin starting at the tail-stock end. This will become less than ½" in diameter when he is finished.



Continuing to form the shape of the pin and working a taper onto the turning which is rotating at about 1150-1500 RPM takes a careful feel and feed into the turning work.




The part supported by the tail-stock will be removed on the finished pin as shown at left above.

Sometimes it becomes necessary to support the work opposite the tool when diameters are severely reduced. Danny is shown here using his finger to support the turning while finishing the shape at the pointed end. Note that the thick part (*head*) is at the tail-stock end of the turning.









Danny also showed what can happen when the grain of the turning piece is not straight with the length of the blank. Turning seems to be doing fine and either the tool catches, a too-quick feed into the turning or a diagonal grain pattern allows the parts to separate.

Using the same rough turning techniques, Danny proceeded to turn a skein pin. Shown here and below are the finishing touches and example when finished.





As one can see at the right, the size of the turning is not large, making turning very precise requiring sharp tools and a steady hand.

Bring your JIGS and FIXTURES that make your turnings shine to the APRIL meeting.

Look for the "Road Kill" turnings at the meeting in MAY and the next month in this newsletter. Tell your friends who may be even mildly interested about the Northland Woodturners Club and invite them to the meeting. Full houses are always welcome.


Till Thursday April 4......
