The year 2025 ushers in the 40th anniversary of the formation of the American Association of Woodturners. In recognition of this event the Turn North feature this month will highlight the history and formation of the organization known as AAW or the American Association of Woodturners.

Background for this feature comes from a book entitled *Woodturning Today a Dramatic Evolution*. This book was published in 2011 as part of the celebration of the 25th anniversary of **AAW** 1986-2011. But I digress. The actual formation came about in October 1985 after numerous symposiums and gatherings over the previous 10 years or so actually gelled during the Woodturning And Concept conference held at the Arrowmont School of Arts and Craft's in Tennessee.

"On the second day of the weekend conference 13 people gathered on the porch of the student dormitory, discussed the idea, and agreed to form the **American Association of Woodturners**." By April of 1986 the final, formal designation and legal work was done and **AAW** became official.

The rest is history and this year the **AAW** celebrates 40 years of providing woodturners world-wide with Symposiums, conferences, publications and other great resources.

Throughout the year 2025 you will get other snippets of detail regarding **AAW** and its history, so stay tuned.

The **Northland Woodturners** is an affiliated club with the **American Association of Woodturners** and as such, provides "official" duespaying members with several benefits. This is especially true when Northland Woodturners provides a program and invites outside people to experience woodturning. This might be at a special turning session on a weekend or at shows like the old **The Wood Show**™.

Kent Townsend did the ultimate considering that the Kansas City Chiefs are now in the Super Bowl. Little did Kent know when he turned this how valuable this could become!!





Danny began his demo with a flat board to make the "umbrella" of his turning assembly. Here you see the initial turning to form what becomes the upper large part of his assembly.

At the right is the turned piece which can form a bowl, the upper part of his assembly or whatever you desire it to become.





As one can see, the light wood part was turned much the same as what is shown in the upper two photos. This formed the basis for what became Danny's version of a Christmas ornament. At the right in that photo is shown the lower finial which was then assembled to form the final piece as shown at the left. Judging from its size and Danny's hand one can tell that the turning from Walnut was somewhat fragile and one slip and it's start-over time.



Great job Danny, showing how to make what looks very complicated become a simple set of operations combined together into an impressive piece. Size can be determined by the maker and one's skill in turning delicate pieces.
